Harmony Hill School Day Students are all biological males, ranging in age from eight through eighteen and grades K -12, regular and special education.

ICD-10 clinical diagnoses including but not limited to:

- PTSD, ADHD, ODD, Adjustment, Anxiety, and Conduct Disorders
- Neurological Disorders
- Sexual Victimization
- Autism Spectrum Disorder

Our comprehensive assessment includes standardized academic testing, functional behavioral assessment, initial psychiatric evaluation and clinical counseling (individual and family). Reports from all disciplines are combined into one succinct document including academic and treatment recommendations.

Our Challenge Course is a series of adventure-based activities designed to help build self-esteem and improve communication, teamwork, and creative problem solving.

Through use of both mental and physical challenges, in an exciting and safe environment, both individuals and the group are able to achieve success.

Before and After School Components >>>

- Based on district bussing the day can begin as early as 7:30 am and ends around 4:15 pm
- Full breakfast in cafeteria
- Placement based on age and developmental level
- Structured before and after school programs and activities from youth care counselors
- Opportunities to stay on campus past 4:15 pm for occasional positive overnight visits for social, athletics, and extra-curricular activities (at no additional cost)
- Extended school year services available
- Work-study program opportunities for high-school students both on and off campus
- Life, social and coping skills groups
- On-site Challenge Course providing adventure based therapy
- Greenhouse and farming activities
- Ability to work with districts on graduation requirements for students

Professional Clinical and Medical Services >>>

- Weekly masters level clinical therapy, including individual, group and family work as appropriate
- OT, PT, and SLP services available on-site
- Medication administration by on-site RN/LPN/CNA
- Opportunity to transfer medication management to our Child & Adolescent Psychiatrist
- Close collaboration with LEA and family to support students in RI, CT, and MA with IEP/PPT
- Specialized clinical services for (biological male to female) transgender youth and other members of the LGBTQQI community

Special Student Populations >>>

- Services to students with complex medical needs including, but not limited to, seizure disorders, diabetes, and severe nut allergies. Other medical conditions considered for services on a case by case basis.
- Smoke free environment
- Peanut/tree nut products not allowed on campus
- Serving LGBTQQI Day Program/Residential student population
